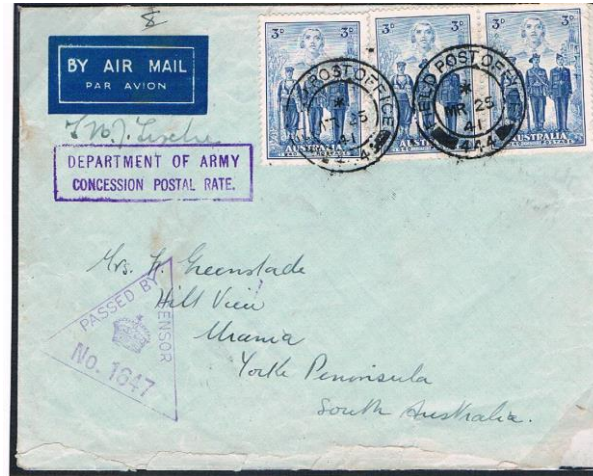

Part II discusses further changes to the system when the military took over handling forces' mail. Listings of Field Post Offices are included. The advent of Commonwealth forces in Egypt and their use of "borrowed" date-stamps, as well as EGYPT POSTAGE PREPAID date-stamps are detailed. The use of "own country" stamps and cancellers brought with them, and "foreign country" allied troops, such as American, Czech, Free French, Polish and Greek forces, also feature. as well as Axis forces and P.O.W.s.

Part III gives details of pre-printed envelopes for forces' mail, On Active Service, Airgraphs, Air Mail Letter Cards and the like. The gradual withdrawal of British troops from Egypt, the Suez Crisis, Operation Musketeer and the United Nations intervention, are all included in great detail.
